The Campus Advocacy, Resources & Education (CARE) office is the primary office on campus responsible for providing education about sexual assault, relationship violence, and stalking. In addition, the CARE Office provides response to and advocacy for survivors and significant others of interpersonal violence on campus.

CARE provides prevention education to students, organizations, and groups across campus on issues related to interpersonal violence, including consent, rape culture, bystander intervention, how to help a friend, and how to connect with CARE.

CARE is hiring for 2 GSR positions beginning in January 2022 to August 31, 2022 up to 400 hours with the option to primarily choose your own hours. Some remote work is available.

Duties:

- Assist in the development of a sustainable infrastructure for graduate student mandatory and ongoing education.
- Conduct focus groups with graduate students to inform prevention education programming and messaging.
- Create assessment tools for CARE programs, and measure the effectiveness of programming efforts. Responsible for modifying programs based on assessment outcomes and maintaining the Program archive of all efforts.
- Support the Assistant Director of Prevention Education in developing a bystander intervention program that focuses on the intersections of racial and identity oppression with experiences of harm.
- Responsible for designing, planning, and implementing research-informed and evidence-based prevention programs for the campus community.

Expectations:

- Must be a currently enrolled UCSB graduate student in good academic standing
- Must be self-driven, independent, and demonstrate strong initiative-taking skills
- Maintain a high level of professionalism
- Must be able to work collaboratively in a team environment
- Experience with research methods, data collection, and analysis
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- Attend supervision meeting with the Assistant Director of Prevention Education
- Knowledge of issues related to interpersonal violence
- Additional project responsibilities as needed
